Spanish political party calls for an Alliance of Democracies, frontier AI governance and a UN Existential Risk Observatory

Alianza Futurista has submitted coordinated policy proposals to the United Nations, the European Parliament and the Government of Spain, calling for new institutions to govern democratic cooperation, frontier artificial intelligence, existential risks, climate geoengineering, human cryopreservation, cultivated meat, longevity science and emergency preparedness.

Madrid, Spain — 7 July 2026 — Alianza Futurista, a Spanish political party and think tank founded in 2013, has submitted a coordinated set of policy proposals to the **Secretary-General of the United Nations**, the **President of the European Parliament** and the **President of the Government of Spain**.

The initiative began with a proposal for an **Alliance of Democracies**: a formal intergovernmental framework through which democratic states could coordinate more effectively in defense of democratic institutions, human rights, the rule of law and long-term global security. From that starting point, the letters developed into a broader governance agenda addressing frontier artificial intelligence, existential risks, climate intervention, biotechnology, longevity science and emergency preparedness.

The three letters are rooted in what the party describes as “**compassionate futurism**”: the responsible use of science, technology and democratic institutions to reduce suffering, protect freedom and improve the long-term prospects of humanity and other sentient beings.

“Humanity now has the technological capacity to reshape intelligence, biology, climate systems and the conditions of life itself,” said **Sergio M.L. Tarrero**, President of Alianza Futurista. “The question is whether our institutions can evolve quickly enough to govern that power democratically, transparently and compassionately.”

A global agenda: democracy, AI, geoengineering and existential risks

In its letter to the **United Nations Secretary-General**, Alianza Futurista presents four main proposals.

First, the party calls for the creation of an intergovernmental **Alliance of Democracies**. It presents the proposed alliance not as a replacement for the United Nations, but as a complementary framework through which democratic governments could coordinate more effectively against authoritarian pressure, hybrid threats, attacks on democratic institutions and the misuse of emerging technologies.

The letter notes that the idea of an Alliance of Democracies has more than two decades of intellectual history, and that initiatives such as the [Alliance of Democracies Foundation](#) have promoted the concept through advocacy, public debate and international convening.

Second, Alianza Futurista calls for a binding international framework for the governance of **frontier artificial intelligence**: advanced AI systems capable of general reasoning, autonomous action or other capabilities with potentially systemic consequences. The party urges the United Nations to facilitate the creation of an international body, comparable in ambition to the International Atomic Energy Agency, with a mandate to monitor, evaluate and coordinate global governance of frontier AI development.

The letter also calls for minimum safety standards, transparency requirements, independent evaluation mechanisms and mandatory incident reporting for the most advanced AI systems. It notes the work of organizations such as [PauseAI](#), [ControlAI](#) and the [Machine Intelligence Research Institute](#), which have argued that uncoordinated frontier AI development may pose serious and potentially existential risks.

“Frontier artificial intelligence is not science fiction,” Tarrero said. “It is already becoming a strategic, economic and security reality. But there is still no binding international framework capable of governing the most powerful systems before they are deployed at scale.”

Third, the letter calls for a multilateral framework for the evaluation and governance of **climate geoengineering**, including approaches such as marine cloud brightening, direct air carbon capture and, over the longer term, space-based solar radiation management. Alianza Futurista does not call for unilateral deployment of geoengineering technologies. Instead, it argues that governance frameworks should be developed before technological feasibility creates pressure for rushed or unilateral decisions.

Fourth, the party proposes the creation of a permanent **United Nations Existential Risk Observatory**: an interdisciplinary body dedicated to monitoring, assessing and publicly communicating risks that could threaten the long-term survival or flourishing of humanity and other sentient beings. These risks include uncontrolled frontier artificial intelligence, engineered pandemics, nuclear escalation, climate catastrophe and other emerging global catastrophic risks.

Europe: strategic autonomy, cryopreservation, cultivated meat and longevity science

In its letter to the **President of the European Parliament**, Alianza Futurista applies the same long-term governance framework to Europe.

The party welcomes the European Union's regulatory leadership on artificial intelligence, but argues that Europe also faces a capability challenge. It calls for stronger **European strategic autonomy in artificial intelligence**, including support for open European foundation models accessible to researchers, public institutions, small and medium-sized enterprises and civil society.

The letter also calls for the European Union to recognize **human cryopreservation as a legitimate end-of-life option** under appropriate safeguards. The proposal concerns the preservation of a human body or brain at ultra-low temperatures after legal death, in the hope that future medical advances may one day make treatment or revival possible. Alianza Futurista calls for a permissive European framework that would recognize the right of citizens to choose cryopreservation after legal death, enable cross-border access to facilities where it is available, and establish minimum ethical and technical standards for informed consent, dignity, safety and family protection.

The European letter further calls for the **authorization and commercialization of cultivated meat produced from animal cells across the European Union**. Cultivated meat is produced without slaughter. Alianza Futurista argues that its approval would allow consumers to choose slaughter-free meat alternatives, reduce animal suffering, lower the environmental footprint of food production, improve food security and help Europe compete in an emerging technological sector.

Finally, the party calls for **longevity science** to become a strategic European research priority, including increased support for biogerontology, senolytics, regenerative medicine and related fields.

"Europe should not only regulate the future," Tarrero said. "It should help build it. Strategic autonomy in artificial intelligence, longevity science, cultivated meat and other emerging technologies is not only an economic question. It is a question of whether European citizens will shape the future or merely import it."

Spain: emergency preparedness and national implementation

The third letter, addressed to the **President of the Government of Spain**, focuses on national implementation and emergency preparedness.

Alianza Futurista urges Spain to prepare for a possible **2026–2027 Super El Niño** event and warns that the country remains vulnerable to heatwaves, wildfires, droughts and extreme rainfall events. The letter calls for reform of the **ES-Alert** public warning system after the failures

revealed by the October 2024 Valencia DANA disaster, stronger Civil Protection capacity, better local emergency structures, improved public vulnerability maps and the integration of artificial intelligence into extreme weather forecasting and emergency response.

The Spanish letter also proposes the creation of a national **Committee for Major Emergencies**, a permanent body responsible for anticipating sanitary, environmental, technological and civil protection risks, preparing contingency plans and coordinating state, regional and local resources during complex emergencies.

In addition, the letter urges Spain to support the proposed **United Nations Existential Risk Observatory**, comply more fully with the **Aarhus Convention** on environmental transparency, regulate **human cryopreservation** in Spain, increase public investment in **biogerontology and longevity science**, and support the authorization of cultivated meat within the European Union and its effective commercialization in Spain.

Why the three letters were submitted together

The three letters were submitted simultaneously because the issues they address cannot be governed effectively by any single institution.

The United Nations has a unique role in convening global cooperation on democratic coordination, existential risks, frontier artificial intelligence and climate geoengineering. The European Union has regulatory, scientific and economic capacity in artificial intelligence, biotechnology, food systems and research policy. National governments, including Spain's, retain direct responsibility for emergency preparedness, public health, environmental transparency and implementation.

Rather than treating democratic resilience, artificial intelligence, biotechnology, climate risk, cultivated meat, longevity, cryopreservation and emergency preparedness as unrelated policy areas, Alianza Futurista presents them as part of a single question: whether democratic institutions can adapt fast enough to govern transformative change in the interest of present and future generations.

Reclaiming transhumanism as democratic and compassionate

Alianza Futurista was the first formally constituted transhumanist political party in the world, registered in Spain on 7 October 2013. The party continues to use the term **transhumanist** in its original humanistic sense: the use of science, technology and reason to improve the human condition, reduce suffering, extend healthy life and expand the possibilities available to present and future generations.

At the same time, Alianza Futurista rejects the association of transhumanism with techno-libertarianism, billionaire individualism, authoritarian politics or the concentration of technological power in the hands of a small number of corporations or states.

For the party, **transhumanism is not the worship of technology or the replacement of politics by markets**. It is a democratic and ethical project: using transformative technologies under public accountability, with safeguards for human rights, animal welfare, institutional transparency, environmental sustainability and the well-being of future generations.

This is why Alianza Futurista increasingly describes its philosophy as **compassionate futurism**: a form of transhumanism centered not on power, disruption or escape from society, but on the reduction of suffering, the protection of freedom, and the responsible governance of technologies that could reshape life on Earth.

Alianza Futurista is a Spanish political party and think tank founded in 2013. It describes its current political philosophy as **compassionate futurism**: the democratic use of science, technology and institutions to reduce suffering, protect freedom and improve the long-term future of humanity and other sentient beings.
