ALIANZA FUTURISTA SENDS LETTERS TO THE UN, THE EUROPEAN PARLIAMENT AND THE GOVERNMENT OF SPAIN ON THE EXISTENTIAL CHALLENGES OF OUR TIME

The Spanish futurist party demands urgent action ahead of the 2026-2027 Super El Niño, calls for international governance of frontier artificial intelligence, and proposes the creation of an Alliance of Democracies and an Existential Risk Observatory

Alianza Futurista, a Spanish political party and think tank founded in 2013, futurist and longevist in orientation and a proponent of "compassionate futurism", which puts technology at the service of reducing the suffering of all sentient beings, has this week sent three institutional letters to the Secretary-General of the United Nations, the President of the European Parliament and the President of the Government of Spain, setting out concrete proposals on what the party regards as the great existential challenges of our time: climate change and the 2026-2027 Super El Niño, frontier artificial intelligence without international governance, and global democratic backsliding.

Three letters, three levels of action

The letter addressed to UN Secretary-General António Guterres develops four proposals: the creation of an Alliance of Democracies as an intergovernmental forum, an idea with more than two decades of intellectual history that has never materialised institutionally; an international body for the governance of frontier AI with an ambition equivalent to that of the International Atomic Energy Agency; a multilateral framework

for the evaluation and governance of climate geoengineering technologies, including space-based solar radiation management systems; and the creation of a permanent Existential Risk Observatory within the United Nations.

The letter to the European Parliament addresses Europe's strategic autonomy in artificial intelligence, noting that in 2024 Europe produced only three notable AI models compared with forty from the United States; the regulation of human cryopreservation as a legitimate end-of-life option; a substantial increase in European funding for longevity science; and the streamlining of the authorisation of cell-cultured meat across the EU.

The letter to the President of the Government of Spain is the most time-critical. With the ECMWF, NOAA and the World Meteorological Organization confirming that the El Niño event developing in 2026 will intensify rapidly over the coming months (NOAA estimates a 63% probability that it will reach the "very strong" category, which would place it among the most intense ever recorded), Alianza Futurista demands concrete measures before September: reform of the ES-Alert public warning system to guarantee specific, accessible alerts issued before the event (and not after it, as happened in the Valencia DANA storm of October 2024, which claimed 229 lives); the reinforcement of Civil Protection with greater local reach; the removal of accumulated vegetation fuel in the areas at highest wildfire risk; the integration of AI into extreme weather forecasting systems; and the active protection of vulnerable populations ahead of the forecast heatwaves.

The Spanish letter also includes demands on human cryopreservation, investment in biogerontology, the authorisation of in vitro meat, and compliance with the Aarhus Convention on environmental transparency.

A different voice in Spanish politics

"While the Spanish political agenda is dominated by the short term, there are threats with a name and a date that will not wait for the next electoral cycle," says Sergio M.L. Tarrero, President of Alianza Futurista. "The 2026 Super El Niño is not a hypothesis: it is a physical phenomenon already under way. Frontier artificial intelligence is not science fiction: it is a reality without an international governance framework. We are sending these letters because we believe someone has to say it clearly, with data and with concrete proposals," Mr Tarrero adds.

Alianza Futurista was the first formally constituted transhumanist political party in the world (7 October 2013), and it reclaims that term in its original sense: the use of science and technology to improve the human condition, and that of all sentient beings, with democratic accountability. In contrast to the techno-libertarian drifts with which the word

has lately been associated, the party champions a transhumanism it also describes as "compassionate futurism": responsible technological progress, extended healthy lifespans, animal welfare and the democratic governance of emerging technologies. A vision defined not on the left-right axis, but on the axis that runs from the present to the future.

The party has just published version 4.0 of its [Statement of Principles](#), a comprehensive document setting out its positions on artificial intelligence, longevity, animal welfare, democratic governance, geoengineering and existential risks, among other topics. It is available in full at alianzafuturista.org. The three institutional letters sent this week are, to a large extent, the translation of that vision into concrete political action.
