Subject: Stakeholder submission — Binding international governance of frontier AI and a permanent Existential Risk Observatory within the United Nations

Dear members of the Joint Secretariat,

We write on behalf of Alianza Futurista, a Spanish political party and think tank founded in 2013 — the first formally constituted transhumanist political party in the world — and a proponent of “compassionate futurism”: putting technology at the service of reducing the suffering of all sentient beings.

We warmly congratulate the Secretariat, the co-chairs and all involved on the successful convening of the inaugural session of the Global Dialogue on AI Governance in Geneva on 6 and 7 July 2026. We follow the process established by General Assembly resolution A/RES/79/325, as a concrete outcome of the Pact for the Future and the Global Digital Compact, with great interest and hope.

By a coincidence we could not have planned, on those very days our party formally submitted a letter to the Secretary-General of the United Nations (attached, and available at <https://alianzafuturista.org/en/letter-to-the-secretary-general-of-the-united-nations/>) addressing precisely the matters the Dialogue exists to advance. Among other proposals, the letter calls for:

1. An international body for the governance of frontier AI systems — those capable of general reasoning, autonomous action and recursive self-improvement — with an ambition analogous to that of the International Atomic Energy Agency;
2. Binding agreements among member states establishing minimum safety standards, transparency requirements and mandatory incident reporting for the most advanced AI systems;
3. The inclusion of civil society organisations, independent researchers and international scientific bodies in any such governance framework, ensuring that it serves humanity as a whole; and
4. The creation of a permanent Existential Risk Observatory within the United Nations: an interdisciplinary body tasked with monitoring, assessing and issuing public alerts on risks that threaten the long-term survival or well-being of humanity and other sentient species.

We regard the Dialogue itself as a validation of the direction of travel: the institutions our letter calls for are beginning to be born. Our submission argues that the next step is to move, in due course, from dialogue to binding frameworks — as was done, ahead of technical feasibility rather than after it, in the field of nuclear non-proliferation.

We therefore respectfully request:

First, that the attached letter be received and considered as a written stakeholder contribution to the consultations feeding the second session of the Global Dialogue (New York, May 2027), alongside the more than 1,500 submissions that informed the inaugural session;

Second, information on the accreditation procedure through which Alianza Futurista, as a formally constituted political organisation and think tank, may participate as a stakeholder in the New York session; and

Third, that the proposal for a permanent Existential Risk Observatory be brought to the attention of the Independent International Scientific Panel on AI, as a possible institutional complement to its assessment work: where the Panel evaluates the science, the Observatory would maintain permanent, public-facing vigilance across the full spectrum of existential risks.

We remain at the Secretariat's disposal for any further information, and would be honoured to contribute to the process in whatever form is most useful.
