PETITION submitted under Article 29 of the Spanish Constitution and Organic Law 4/2001, of 12 November, regulating the Right of Petition

Subject: Spain's position at the United Nations on the governance of frontier artificial intelligence, existential risks and cooperation among democracies

Dear Minister,

Alianza Futurista, a Spanish political party registered in the Register of Political Parties since 2013, on 6 July 2026 sent institutional letters to the Secretary-General of the United Nations, the President of the European Parliament and the President of the Government of Spain, published in full on our website (alianzafuturista.org). In the letter addressed to the Secretary-General we proposed, among other measures: the creation of an Alliance of Democracies as an intergovernmental forum; an international body for the governance of frontier artificial intelligence with an ambition analogous to that of the International Atomic Energy Agency, with binding agreements on minimum safety standards, transparency and incident reporting; and the establishment of a permanent Existential Risk Observatory within the United Nations.

On 6 and 7 July 2026 — coinciding exactly with the dispatch of our letters — the inaugural session of the Global Dialogue on AI Governance was held in Geneva, established by General Assembly resolution A/RES/79/325 as a concrete outcome of the Pact for the Future, with the participation of all 193 Member States. The second session will be held in New York in May 2027. Spain, as a Member State, has a voice in this process; Spanish citizens and organisations have only the voice their Government chooses to give them.

Accordingly, and given that the State's external action falls to the Government through your Ministry, we submit, under the aforementioned Organic Law 4/2001, the following requests for information and for a position to be taken:

First. That the Ministry inform us of Spain's position at the inaugural session of the Global Dialogue on AI Governance (Geneva, 6-7 July 2026): whether Spain made a written or oral contribution, and to what effect.

Second. That the Ministry state whether Spain will advocate, within that Dialogue and the General Assembly, for the evolution from a forum for exchange towards binding international frameworks for the governance of frontier artificial intelligence, including minimum safety standards, transparency requirements and mandatory incident reporting for the most advanced systems.

Third. That the Ministry state Spain's position on the creation of a permanent Existential Risk Observatory within the United Nations — an interdisciplinary body for the monitoring, assessment and early warning of the risks that threaten the long-term survival or well-being of humanity — and whether Spain would be willing to promote or support such an initiative.

Fourth. That the Ministry state Spain's position on the creation of an Alliance of Democracies as a structured intergovernmental forum for cooperation among democratic States, a concept with more than two decades of intellectual history that has never materialised institutionally.

Fifth. That the Ministry forward our letter of 6 July 2026 to the Secretary-General of the United Nations, a copy of which is enclosed, to the Permanent Mission of Spain to the United Nations, for its information.

In accordance with Articles 6.2 and 11 of Organic Law 4/2001, we request acknowledgement of receipt of this petition within ten days, and its reply within a maximum of three months.

Spain has a long tradition of commitment to multilateralism. The questions we raise — who governs the most powerful technologies ever created, and who watches over the risks that threaten humanity as a whole — will define the coming decades. We believe

Spain can and should be among the countries that lead these responses, not among those that wait for them.

We remain at the Ministry's disposal for any consultation, technical contribution or dialogue it may consider appropriate, and ask you to accept, Minister, the assurances of our highest consideration.
